You may have read in the newspaper that Central Missouri Food Bank is receiving much good, nutritious food through the Emergency Assistance Program as part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. I also read this and saw pictures of many cases of American Cheese being unloaded at the Food Bank. I called to start our order for August 19, totally expecting to be Allotted some of the cheese. To my surprise, they told me that all of the food through the Assistance program will go to USDA agencies. In the whole area which the CMFB serves there are only 10 USDA Agencies. This means that these agencies will receive lots of nutritious food and the rest of the Agencies will just have to fend for themselves. I do not think the Food Bank is any happier about this than those of us who are left out are. I suspect that this is just another case of government beaurocracy gone haywire

Last month I said that we were getting low on canned goods. Due to the generous outpouring of churches and individuals in the community I am proud to say that at this time our shelves are getting replenished. We all have to realize though that, just like a grocery store, there is a constant in and out of food on the shelves. And though they are filled today, by Tuesday they may be looking bare again. The same is true of our walk in cooler. Today we have LOTS of lettuce, apples, potatoes, orange juice and yogurt smoothies. Again there is a constant need for replacing foods as we give food to our clients.

There are certain foods like sugar, flour, dry milk and gelatin desert, etc. which are given to each family that receives food. These items seldom come from the food bank or donations, Thus they must be purchased with money which you have contributed.

As you probably know Christos does not have any paid staff. All of us who work there are volunteers and are happy to give of our time to help those who are in need of food. Our overhead expenses include rent and utilities plus the cost of the foods that I mentioned above. Just as our clients have been hit by the increasing cost of food and utilities so has your Christos 'Center. For a long time our income equaled our expenses but during the last several months, the expenses have exceeded the income.. While Christos is not supposed to be, and has never been, a money making organization. Our Board does become alarmed when your contributions do not match the expenses. I have faith though that when donors know of the increased need, God will guide them to increase their contribution and there-by allow Christos to help fill the food needs of the needy in Randolph County.
