TAX INFORMATION

How the IRS views charitable fundraising dinner auctions

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has ruled that it is the responsibility of the sponsoring organization to inform potential donors regarding what is considered a tax-deductible donation, and what is not.

Tax deductible gifts are a one-way, one-time avenue in the eyes of the IRS. There can never be a two-way benefit on events for charity. Only money paid over and above the "fair market price" can be deducted by the purchaser as a tax deduction.

The Auction book serves as our disclosure of the value of each auction item as determined in good faith by the donor. For Federal income tax purposes, you may declare a deduction only on the amount you spend in excess of the estimated value of the goods or services.

Please keep the Auction book and paid receipts for any purchased items for your income tax records.

Purchase of Raffle tickets of any kinds are not tax deductible.

You are also entitled to a charitable contribution to the extent that the cost of the dinner tickets the "fair market value" of the meal. In this case, the good faith tax deduction is \$30.00 per person.

NOTE

You should contact your tax advisor for a full explanation of the charitable deduction tax laws.
